Slide 1:

Niizh waashkeshiwag imaa noopoming. – Two deer are in the woods.

Niiwin waaboozoog imaa noopoming. – Four rabbits are in the woods.

Aaniin minik awesiwag imaa noopoming? – How many animals are in the woods? Ingodwaaswi awesiwag ayaag noopoming. – Six animals are in the woods.

Slide 2:

Niizh waashkeshiwag wiisiniwag. – Two deer are eating in the woods.

Bezhig waashkeshi minikwe onji-ziibiinsing. – One deer is drinking from the stream.

Aaniin minik waashkeshiwag ayaag? - How many deer are there?

Niswi waashkeshiwag. - There are three dear.

Slide 3:

Naanan abinoojiiyag odaminowag. – Five children are playing.

Niizh abinoojiiyag nibaawag. – Two children are sleeping.

Aaniin minik abinoojiiyag imaa? – How many children are there?

Niizhwaaswi abinoojiiyag. – There are seven children.

Slide 4:

Siipiising izhaawag niizh ikwewag. – Two women are going to Belcourt.

Mikinaak Ode izhaawag niswi ikwewag. – Three women are going to Dunseith.

Aaniin minik ikwewag izhaawag imaa Mikinaak Ode? – How many women are going to Dunseith?

Niswi izhaawag imaa Mikinaak Ode. – Three of them went to Dunseith.

Slide 5:

Waabooz amwag niiwin opiniig. – The rabbit is eating four potatoes.

Wiiba noongom awe waabooz gii-amwa bezhig opin. – Earlier today that rabbit ate one potato.

Aaniin minik opiniig gii-amwaad awe waabooz? – How many potatoes did that rabbit eat? Naanan opiniig. – Five potatoes.
